
What you need to know about your gas bill

Your bill includes a lot of information about your gas charges and usage. Our bill guide helps you understand your bill and may help with monitoring the amount of gas your business uses.

Match the green numbers on the bill with the corresponding numbers below.

- Your company name and billing address.
- A unique identifier we use to identify and link multiple accounts.
- The unique identifier for your gas account. This is the number to quote when you make enquiries with us.
- 4 The physical address where the gas is supplied.
- The date the invoice is issued.
- 6 The period covered by this invoice.
- The amount due from your previous invoice.
- This is the amount still owing or the amount you've paid in excess of what was owed on your last bill.
- 9 The total amount owed (including GST) for the invoice period.
- 10 The unique number for this invoice.
- The total amount payable (including any overdue amounts and GST).
- EnergyAustralia's contact phone number.
- This is your distributor's 24hr contact phone number. Please quote your MIRN number (DPI number for NSW customers) located on your account in the event of a gas supply fault.
- Energy Australia's contact email address.
- 15 The due date for payment.
- The total amount payable (including any overdue amounts and GST).





What you need to know about your gas bill

Match the green numbers on the bill with the corresponding numbers below.

- 1 The DPI (Delivery Point Identifier for NSW customers only) or MIRN (Meter Installation Registration Number for all other states) is the unique number assigned to your supply point by your distributor.
- This is the contract type for your bill.
- 3 Energy Consumption

Gas Commodity Charge: Your Contracted Energy Rate (\$/GJ)

The Gas Commodity Charge Rate and the Fixed Monthly Charge (NSW) are derived from the Contract ACQ (Annual Contract Quantity), MDQ (Maximum Daily Quantity) & MHQ (Maximum Hourly Quantity) requirements as nominated by the customer

Meter Data Handling Fee: The costs determined using the rates approved under a contract, for Transmission Services applicable from the Injection Point to the Transfer Point during the relevant Invoicing Period.

AEMO Market Charge: An Australian Energy Market Operator (AEMO) charge for supplying gas under this Contract (VIC customers only).

STTM Market Fees: Short Term Trading Market (STTM) fees, determined by AEMO from time to time for operating the STTM.

Longford Transmission Delivery Charge:

The transmission charge for the delivery cost component associated with the transporting of gas in the transmission system.

Longford Peak Inject Charges: The injection charge for actual quantities of gas injected on behalf of the customer into the transmission system on the 10 peak injection days.

Coastal Extension Total Charge:

The Carisbrook to Ararat, Stawell and Horsham Gas Transmission Pipeline maintenance charge.

Note: For NSW, SA and ACT, the transmission is a fixed charge.


4 Network Usage

Network Section Charge Total: The distribution charge for the delivery cost component associated with the transporting of gas on the distribution system. Distribution charges are charged in accordance with the Contract (customer agreement).

Operations and Maintenance:

Where applicable, the Operations and Maintenance Charges, Local Capacity Charges, and Infrastructure Charges will be charged in accordance with the Contract (customer agreement).

Provision of Metering Charges: Where applicable, all charges relating to the Customer's Metering Equipment including, but not limited to, installation, testing, replacement, reading, alteration or maintenance of the Metering Equipment.



- Gas losses incurred in transporting throughout the network system.
- 6 Your contracted energy rate.
 - This graph shows your gas usage over the last 12 months. You may notice changes in your daily usage. There are several factors which could change your average daily usage, such as the installation of new appliances, a change of season or a shift in your usage habits.
- 8 Maximum Hourly Quantity.
- Maximum Daily Quantity.

- Total amount of gas you used for this account and bill period.
- The total amount of gas you used for the same bill period last year.
- 12 The due date for payment.
- The total amount payable (including any overdue amounts and GST).
