

PRICING FOR LARGE BUSINESS CUSTOMERS - DEFAULT RATES (ELECTRICITY)

The following Default Rates are valid from 1 April 2022 until further notice:

Australian Capital Territory and New South Wales

Peak: 7am-9am and 5pm-8pm, EST. Business Days.

Shoulder: (charged at Peak rate): 9am-5pm and 8pm-10pm, EST. Business Days.

Off Peak: All other times

South Australia

Peak: 7am-9pm, CST. Business Days.

Off-Peak: All other times

Queensland

Peak: 7am-11pm, EST. Business Days.

Off-peak: All other times

Victoria

Peak: 7am-11pm, EST. Monday to Friday.

Off-peak: All other times

What are Default Rates?

Default Rates are a charge (per kWh of electricity delivered) that EnergyAustralia reasonably determines is necessary to recover its costs of acquiring electricity, plus a reasonable margin. Default Rates are set by EnergyAustralia and may be amended by EnergyAustralia at any time.

Which customers may be affected by Default Rates?

The Default Rates above only apply in respect of electricity customers in the relevant States who meet the definition of "large customer" under Australian electricity laws.

When do Default Rates apply?

The Default Rates will apply if:

- a) you previously entered into an agreement with EnergyAustralia for the purchase of electricity for your premises, which has now expired or terminated; or
- b) you have not yet entered into any agreement with an electricity retailer for the purchase of electricity for your premises, and EnergyAustralia is financially responsible for electricity supplied to that premises.

The Default Rates will not apply if:

- a) you enter into a new agreement with EnergyAustralia with an agreed energy charge; or
- b) you enter into an agreement with another energy retailer and notify us that another energy retailer is financially responsible to supply electricity for your premises; or
- c) you no longer meet the definition of a 'large customer' under Australian electricity laws; or
- d) your premises are disconnected.

For customers with an estimated load of greater than 10 GWh per annum, EnergyAustralia reserves the right to alternatively charge a default rate equal to the pool price plus a margin of 15%.

What other charges apply?

If Default Rates apply to you, then the following other charges will also apply: market charges, service charges, energy loss charges, distribution charges, network charges, regulatory and other charges.
