Willing locals volunteer for tree planting

Green-thumbed TRUenergy employees, Conservation Volunteers Australia helpers and community members have planted over 900 trees, shrubs and grasses along Duck Creek- part of a tree planting day organised by TRUenergy to improve the local environment.

Volunteers have been working on the site for the past six months, planting trees and building a 1.4 kilometre walking trail along the banks of Duck Creek.
