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	CI C member: Doos TPH longray look into Coal Scam Cas?		
	CLG member: Does TRUenergy look into Coal Seam Gas?		
	<b>Graham:</b> TRUenergy are essentially a contractor of gas services. We have a 20% interest in a coal seam gas project, Narrabri Gas Project. Santos have taken over ownership and operation of this project and are currently returning the plant to best practice.		
4.0	Tallawarra Lands – Anthony Savenkov, TRUenergy; Paul Grech and Peter Johnson, Statutory Planners, Grech Planning		
	Anthony Savenkov – General Maintenance and Repair		
	A re-emerging issue for the site is feral pigs. They are a concern because they can destroy native flora and fauna, potentially spread disease, and also attract illegal hunting.		
	Anthony Savenkov - Concept Plan application		
	TRUenergy has responded to feedback received during exhibition with the Preferred Project Application it has lodged for exhibition with the Department of Planning & Infrastructure.		
	Anthony pointed out the key refinements to the Concept Plan, including:-		
	<ul> <li>Core uses and locations are the same except for some minor adjustments. E.g. The northern precinct has a slightly different layout and ridge area; there is now a dedicated cycle lane in this area.</li> </ul>		
	• The colour of lines (on the plans) marking shared-use paths and other paths has been changed to make the distinction clearer.		
	<ul> <li>A potential road connection to Hayward's Bay has been included (detailed planning will follow).</li> </ul>		
	<b>CLG member:</b> Could you explain more about the link to Haywards Bay? Wouldn't it be better to take the road that currently goes through the lake area around the wetlands?		
	<b>Anthony</b> : Based on the feedback of government agencies and others, a secondary link has been reinstated to provide better connectivity. The conceptual route is directly route along an embankment of the former railway line. This avoids a pocket of higher value conservation land to its west. The masterplan is at concept stage approval stage; subject to approval, elements such as this road alignment will undergo further detailed planning and design.		
	CLG member: What are you going to do with the bridge?		
	<b>Anthony</b> : Flood modelling indicates that the bridge is a flood hazard, so will likely need to be replaced by one with a more flood-friendly design.		
	CLG member: Is the second main entrance roughly at the Yallah Woolshed?		
	Anthony: The potential entrance is about 500 metres north of the Woolshed.		

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	Paul Grech – Infrastructure Delivery Strategy	
	The Concept Plan will have a new, though similar, set of commitments relating to consultation requirements for the provision of infrastructure and ownership of lands. Grech Planners have been commissioned to take these commitments to the next stage. E.g. Grech will consult with Wollongong City Council (local infrastructure), State Government (state infrastructure) and Lake Illawarra Authority (open space/conservation lands) and conservation land managers such as Bush Heritage Australia.	
	To date we have held one meeting with each of the government organisations to determine:	
	how open space will be divided up	
	Potential planning mechanisms will be used to transfer ownership	
	Potential ownership models.	
	<b>CLG members:</b> Wouldn't you still need agreement with RMS about road maintenance?	
	<b>Paul</b> : Local roads, community facilities, connecting subways and pathways and local drainage that have to stay in local ownership will be identified for transfer to Council or a local authority.	
	State government infrastructure is mainly regional or arterial roads. The legislation for the planning controls for the area requires all applicants to make appropriate arrangements with the State government for state infrastructure.	
	Draft documents require developers pay money to the State government that contributes to a list of infrastructure items including road infrastructure. TRUenergy is investigating if it would be better to provide this infrastructure outright rather than the payment.	
	CLG member: What about the Sydney Water Strategy?	
	<b>Paul</b> : There will be no timing delay for Sydney Water to supply water and sewage infrastructure for Tallawarra. We will meet the standard requirement for a water strategy. This will not have to be consulted on separately. We will also meet the requirement for a Utility Services Strategy.	
	CLG member: Are you still proposing senior's living?	
	<b>Anthony</b> : Yes, this option is an important part of the concept plan, and all of its relevant supporting studies (e.g. traffic, bushfire risk) have taken this use into account.	
5.0	Tallawarra Lands Concept Plan – Anthony Savenkov, TRUenergy	
	Superlot scheme	
	The Tallawarra Lands site comprises many land parcels. The next key step for TRUenergy is to rationalise these in order that they align with the Concept Plan, which in turn reflects Council's Local Environment Plan zoning.	
	Among other things, this will help with an orderly staging of the	

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	development, and for the delivery of soft and hard infrastructure to be allocated to specific stages.		
	Cadastral history of Tallawarra Lands		
	Anthony provided a PowerPoint presentation outlining the history of previous subdivisions of the site, and how these have resulted in the current land parcels.		
6.0	Other matters		
	Brendan Blakeley from Elton Consulting asked the group if there were any other issues for discussion. No further questions were raised.		
7.0	Close and next meeting
